

Franklin C. Moore

Franklin Moore, as a career member of the U.S. Senior Executive Service (SES), served twice as Deputy Assistant Administrator (DAA) for the U.S. Agency for International Development's (USAID) Africa Bureau (2012-2014 and 2008-2010). This is the highest civil service, career position in the Bureau. He also served as Agency coordinator for both Food Security and Climate Change during 2009. He was one of 66 members of the SES to receive a Presidential Distinguished Service Award. In between serving as DAA, Mr. Moore, was Senior Development Counselor to the U.S. Mission to the United Nations Agencies in Rome.

Mr. Moore joined the SES in 2000 as Deputy Director of the USAID Environment Center. During this period, he was responsible for the Agency's programs in the areas of biodiversity and water, energy, climate change and urban programs. With reorganization, Mr. Moore served (October 2002 to 2008) as Director of the Office of Environment and Science Policy responsible for climate change and agricultural research.

Prior to joining USAID in 1998, Mr. Moore held positions in the areas of agriculture, environment and natural resource management with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency responsible for the International natural resource and forest portfolio. Resident in Zimbabwe and Malawi, 1985 through 1987, Mr. Moore served as the southern Africa regional agribusiness specialist with the NGO Africare; and held positions with the Peace Corps both in West Africa and Washington. . Mr. Moore has worked in approximately 40 countries overseas.

Mr. Moore has a bachelor's degree in Economics with a minor in Art History from Yale University. He received a master's degree in Agricultural Economics, and a certificate in African Studies from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.
